



# **Graduation Requirements** for the BIS Diploma 2017

Our graduation requirements reflect the IB programme philosophy. We require:

- Participation in six courses, each from a different subject group, during grades 11 and 12 (other than TOK)
- An average score of 20 points across all six courses over the two years
- Successful meeting of all BIS Creativity, Action, and Service (CAS) requirements
- Grade 11 non-Diploma students (IB Courses only) are expected to attend and pass the first year of TOK
- Successful completion of PE in Grades 11 & 12
- Attendance as per school policy: 20 days absent maximum per academic year

To complement the BIS Diploma, students may also opt for the IB Subject Courses or the full IB Diploma.

Since 2006, 67-100% of BIS graduates have earned the IB Diploma.

The Head of School reserves the right to amend graduation requirements for special circumstances (students with documented learning needs, transfer students, students experiencing major health problems).

# Co-curricular Activities, International Conferences, and Sports


- Generous offering of activities in sport, academics, and performing arts
